### Traffic Rules

We continue to have problems with staff (and visitors) not obeying the traffic rules & regulations on campus – this places both Individuals & staff at risk.



**All** campus roads are 15mph. This seems slow, but you have to be able to stop suddenly when someone walks out in front of you. Driving 15mph (or less) makes a big difference.



Several roads on campus are “One Way” – it’s very important that you watch for the signs and travel the correct way.



This is especially important on Circle Drive!

Vehicles (both State & personal) must be **locked at all times**. You can leave your window down 1-1.5” for ventilation when it’s hot.



Stop Signs don’t mean “slow down and look”. You must come to a **full stop** at all stop signs and then proceed when the area is clear. We are in Texas – California stops aren’t allowed!

When a behavior crisis is occurring in the roadway you **cannot** drive down the road! We see staff & visitors placing Individuals at major risk of harm because of being too lazy to wait or go around. This can be a career ending move as well.
