Did you Know?

Did you know that a 4444/911 must be called for any complaints of chest pain?

When a resident complains of chest pain, or pain that can be related to a cardiac event, then 4444/911 must be called **immediately**. If the Treatment Room RN arrives on the scene before EMS, they are to assess the resident and notify the covering PCP.

The covering PCP can make the determination to cancel EMS based on the nursing assessment. Medical Providers are the **ONLY** personnel that can make that determination. If the PCP chooses to cancel EMS, then the operator must be notified.

Other pain/assessment data that can be associated with cardiac events include:

- upper gastric pain
- tingling/pain/numbness of the upper extremities, especially the left arm
- pain in the middle of the mid to upper back
- extreme fatigue
- dizziness/fainting
- shortness of breath

A few months ago, the OIO Central Office sent letters to every LAR and Primary Contact for feedback info on their loved one and the Facility. This parent felt better about calling then writing an email or letter. The AIO's are usually supposed to keep information given to them confidential, but this LAR said the AIO could share the conversation to anyone and everyone.

The call was from a mom who's daughter was admitted when she was 4 years old. The family was told she was not to live past 7 years old. She is currently 52.

Mom said the only way that her daughter has thrived so long is from all the great care that she is receiving here. She gave a shout out to the caring staff, the nursing staff and Doctors meticulously monitoring her health, the constant communication she receives to stay in the know. She stated that yes there have been a couple of ANE cases concerning her daughter, but most of those issues could have happened at home.

She said that she is blessed that her daughter lives here and has never had any major complaints and can't remember any minor complaints.
