Why a Fence?

As you have likely seen, our new fence is almost done. We hope to have the final pieces in place no later than March 15th. There have been some questions about the fence and our changing population – we hope this helps.

Q: Why did we get the fence?

A: There are actually a couple of reasons:

The area around the campus has changed dramatically in the last 18 months. In the past, we were basically out here by ourselves. Oldham Forbes went in several years ago but this was the only true construction in our area. Since then, however, we have added a new apartment complex to our south and a huge addition is going in immediately to our north. This includes 40+ duplexes that will literally be on top of our north fence line. There is also a <u>very</u> large housing subdivision being built at the corner of Maple & South 27th. The fence will go a long way in keeping strangers from wandering through campus and make it a much safer environment for all. Think "gated community" in town – these are popular and **expensive** places to live!

Next is our changing population. We are getting some very capable Individuals but many can't fully understand the dangers of leaving campus. The fence will help keep them safe while actually giving them more freedom on campus itself.

Q. How will the planned construction on Maple affect our entrances?

A. Work on Maple Street is scheduled to start in 2-3 months based on the last update from the city. They are changing it to a 4-lane road (no turn lane) so it's likely we will see more and more traffic. It's possible we will have to shift our entrances around (and maybe use the back gate again) while construction is going on. Other than that, no changes are planned.

Q. There is a gate across the road to Oakwood Trails. How we will we get down there to use the Lodge, trails and playground?

A. We are still working out the logistics for this one. There will be an electric opener on this gate with a combination keypad but the exact "how" we will have access to this area is still in discussion. This area, of course, is an important part of the campus and enjoyed by many – we aren't cutting it off.
