



Building Egress Maps

Each occupied building on the campus has a **Building Egress Map** that shows various safety components of the building, including exits, locations of fire extinguishers and where



the Safe Zone is located. One of the most important items shown is the location of the **Fire Alarm Panel**. It's important that you are familiar with the safety aspects of any building you are in but even more so for homes and other buildings frequently used by those living at AbSSLC.


Each egress map will include a "Your are here" star that helps orient you in the building and where the various items are.

Reporting ANE

The number to report ANE (Abuse/ Neglect & Exploitation) changed as of March 1st. The new number to call is 1-800-458-9858.

After regular business hours you will leave a message so it's critically important that you make the **Directors Call** (by dialing the Switchboard) first and then call the 1-800 number.
